## **Tabor Children's House Seeks Sponsors to Complete Funding for a New Playground that Will Combine Fun with Safety**

Tabor Children's House, a nonprofit child care center *visible* from Main Street and New Britain Road in Doylestown Township, is seeking funds to complete the campaign for its \$100,000 playground renovation project, scheduled for Spring 2010. Major funding already is secured for the project, including a \$75,000 lead grant from the Nonprofit Finance Fund (NFF) and a \$10,000 grant from the Bucks County Foundation.

The design for the new playground at Tabor Children's House features physical activity structures and rubber surfacing on the ground that will enhance the center's emphasis on safety, as well as permanent shade structures that will complement the center's ongoing sun safety initiative. Appropriate for a wide range of ages, the three planned activity structures are: a Toddler Play System with a tot slide and crawling areas; an Explorer Play System with a rock wall, three variations on the slide, a beanstalk climber and crawl tunnels; and a Locomotive with slides, a crawl tunnel and climbing areas.

Primary sponsors for the Toddler Play System, the Explorer Play System, and the Locomotive, each at \$5,000, will be recognized on highly visible signs erected in the playground. Sponsors at \$1,000 and patrons at \$500 will be included on signs attached to the fencing that surrounds the playground. Tabor's development office welcomes inquiries at 215-348-4071 x219.

The Bucks County Foundation is a charitable trust created to serve Bucks County and its residents. Tabor Children's House, which celebrated its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary in February, is a private, nonprofit community child development center, licensed through the PA Department of Public Welfare, and offering a daily schedule of before and after school care, day care from infants to kindergarten and a summer camp program. Tabor Children's House is committed to providing quality early care and education in a safe, nurturing, culturally-competent environment that helps to develop the potential of all children.
